The BUILT WITH CHOCOLATE MILK Coaches Challenge is looking for Nebraska high school coaches whose teams build it with low fat chocolate milk to share their story for a chance to win a \$10,000 grant for their athletic program.

HOW IT WORKS

One (1) \$10,000 grant and two (2) \$5,000 grants for your athletic program are up for grabs! Beginning **September 18**, coaches of high school-aged athletes can share how their team builds it with chocolate milk, incorporating it into their training and practice routine and the important role chocolate milk plays in the success of your high school athletes. There are two (2) ways to enter*:

Submissions will only be accepted from September 18 – October 13. Contest finalists will then be selected by a panel of judges and the top 10 entries will move onto a public voting period on BUILT WITH CHOCOLATE MILK's Facebook and Twitter pages. The entry with the most votes will receive the \$10,000 grant grand prize and the two runner up entries will each receive a \$5,000 grant for their athletic programs.
