## Session 2: Post Development Drills

**Importance of In-Traffic / Contact Finishes in Practice vs Mikan and Jump Hooks on Air** - Many players finish extremely effectively without contact in these drills yet are exposed vs a bod / contact.

**Off-hand Placement** – Crucial to effectively finishing or getting fouled.

**Bags or Bodies on Every Finish, Every Time** – don't develop false sense of where finishing angles will be available. Practice Planning aspect of this....who do you have available to do what?

**Base Post Breakdown Segment** – Power Hop, Double Move (Quick Spin 1 and 2 Dribbles), Freeze Move (Fake Spin)...from there, work pivots to rim, Up and Under.

Drills that incorporate "Quick Twitch" Finishes - Early Body Position

"Step, Dribble, Hop" / Power Hop vs Traditional Drop Set – Knowing when to use each and knowing that some body types / player bases are better for certain movements.

**"Positionless" Concept** - Working guard drills with posts while keeping understanding of what carries over to live play. Open and honest communication about who has the "green light" to do what.

**Triangle Attack Series for Posts** – Finishing off 1 foot, 2 feet, mid-range - "at-rim" finishes vs floaters – finishes that can get you fouled or allow you an ORB opportunity

"Push" Cone Drills - Getting post players used to catching the ball in various positions / finishing in different areas. Get them out of their comfort zone.

Bad Pass Drill - Great for teams that ball screen regularly.
